

Knightdale, North Carolina

Eastern Wake's fast-growing suburb — Knightdale Station Park, newer housing, and value relative to closer-in Raleigh.

Welcome

Knightdale attracts relocating families and first-time buyers who want newer housing, parks, and a more attainable price point while staying in Wake County.

The centerpiece is Knightdale Station Park. Everyday retail and dining cluster along Knightdale Boulevard (Business U.S. 64).

History

Incorporated 1927. A 1940 downtown fire destroyed much of the commercial core. Sewer infrastructure in the late 1980s opened major residential growth; the 1990s population surge made it one of North Carolina's faster-growing towns. Growth continues with new master-planned communities.

Why Locals Love It

Value, newer housing, Knightdale Station Park, and reasonable access to Raleigh.

Local Tip: If you only visit one place, go to Knightdale Station Park — the clearest expression of the town's investment in family amenities.

Education

Knightdale High School and other WCPSS schools. Confirm assignments at wcpss.net — eastern Wake boundaries shift with growth.

Things to Do

Knightdale Station Park (playground, splash pad, fields, trails). Parks and greenways town-wide. About 15–25 minutes to central Raleigh. Town site: knightdalenc.gov.
